**DVAA Announces
Fellowship Winners**

DELAWARE VALLEY ARTS Alliance, through its Fellowship Program for Visual Artists, announces three winners for 2002: Linda Sokolowski, a painter and printmaker from Swan Lake, NY; Salvatore Romano, a sculptor from Jeffersonville, NY; and Cara Enteles, a painter from Damascus, PA. Each artist will receive \$3,000. Funding was made possible by a grant from a private foundation to support the creation and exhibition of visual arts and crafts.

Linda Sokolowski, an artist involved with drawing, painting and printmaking, received an undergraduate degree in painting from Rhode Island School of Design and a graduate degree in printmaking from the University of Iowa. Her work has been exhibited extensively in both group and solo shows at galleries and museums such as the Pushkin Museum in Moscow, the Albright-Knox in Buffalo and Kraushaar Galleries in New York and is in public collections that include IBM, Pepsico and the Portland, ME Museum.

Salvatore Romano's work has been exhibited in museums such as the Aldrich in Connecticut, the New Jersey State Museum, and the Centro Musee Graphico in Taverna, Italy and galleries throughout Manhattan and the Boroughs including the A.I.R. and Pardo/

Lattuada. Formally trained at the Arts Students League in New York and the Academie de La Grande Chaumiere in Paris, France, Romano has received, among others, awards from the National Endowment for the Arts and New York Foundation for the Arts.

Cara Enteles received her education at the École Nationale Supérieure des Beaux-Arts, in Paris, France, and the Parsons School of Design in New York. Her artwork has been exhibited in New York at Artists Space, Gen Art, and Radix Gallery, and in upstate venues such as The Woodstock Guild in Woodstock, NY, and the Barrett House Gallery in Poughkeepsie.

Delaware Valley Arts Alliance administers several grant programs on behalf of artists and arts organizations in its service area. This year, grant money distributed by the Arts Alliance from both private and public sources exceeded \$50,000.
